Rev. Maria Magdalena Pino; June 1, 1916 – July 24, 2010; Maria Magdalena Mary M. Pino was born in Tepic, Nayarit, Mexico, to the large family of Antonio Olivas and Felicitas Lopez Olivas. Her father, was a potter, became a Methodist minister and in 1925 moved his family to a pastorate in Tempe, Arizona. Later Mary attended Lydia Patterson Institute in El Paso, Texas, and was valedictorian of her class. Her father then pastored a circuit of churches in New Mexico often accompanied by Mary who met Francisco Pino, with whom she was married for 50 years. After his service in World War II, they moved to Phoenix, Arizona. She served the church in ways ranging from director of a Wesley Center to President of the Council of Hispanic American Ministries. She studied at Perkins Theological Seminary at Southern Methodist University and was one of the first ordained Hispanic women. She pastored churches, in Floresville and El Paso, before retiring to San Antonio in 1992 after the death of her husband. She is survived by brother Mardy Olivas, son Frank wife Barbara, and numerous nieces and nephews. Donations may be made to El Divino Salvador UMC, 1701W.
