Maria De Los Angeles Campos Cerda Viuda de Reyes, age 79, San Antonio, Texas, passed away on May 11, 2020, surrounded by her children. Daughter of Filiberto Campos and Gregoria Cerda.

Maria was born in Progreso Coahuila, Mexico, on March 9, 1941. She had 5 siblings and after their parents passed away they were all separated and were cared for by other family members. She left her home at a very young age because she did not want to become a burden to anyone, and decided to come to the United States. Other relatives came after her to start their lives in San Antonio, Austin and Dallas, Texas. This is when she began the planting of her seeds which overtime grew to start a better life for her and her family.

She came to work for Matt Garcia and family by helping them raise their four children, David, Sissy, Junior, and Cynthia Garcia. She later met her husband, Raul Reyes Sr., and moved to Uvalde Texas. They soon had 3 children, Rebecca L. Martinez, Cynthia M. Reyes-Rodriguez, and Raul Reyes Jr. Shortly after 4 years of marriage in 1970, Raul Reyes Sr. passed away leaving Maria with 3 children to raise on her own. She began her journey and moved to San Antonio to return to work for the Garcia family. After several years of dedicated work to the Garcia family, she left to start employment with Amigo's Tortilla company and part-time waitressing. This is where her life's work of caring for others began, she opened her home for many relatives allowing them to stay until they had an opportunity to get their own place. She helped her sister, Blanca, by caring and providing a home for 3 of her daughters Ana,

Letty, Juany Maltos. Who later started their own independent lives. Relatives including Robertin Velez and many more came to her home and left to start their own lives. Also, assisting them with employment by hiring them at Amigo's Tortilla Company when she became supervisor. During the summer time, she even gave her children summer jobs. After many years of dedication and loyalty to Amigo's Tortilla company, it was sold and she left to continue her journey and found another passion, caring for the elderly. She cared for many elderly throughout her lifetime and this is how her life ended doing what she loved. During this time, she was filled with joy because her first grandchildren were born. She was very involved and caring for Dylan and Erica, her first grandchildren, later she enjoyed many more blessings. Yvonne, Sophia, Jordan, Priscilla, Sergio, Caleb, Joshua and Jacob were the rest of her grandchildren. She also got to enjoy her great grandchildren, Jeremy, Achilles, and Jayce.

Maria felt that it was important for her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren to get an education because of the struggles in her own personal life. She was a beautiful strong hardworking woman, who wanted to be a model of good work ethic to her loved ones. Most importantly, she left behind a legacy for her loved ones to perceive how nothing will be given to us without strength and hardwork.

While caring for the elderly she was diagnosed with lymphatic cancer in the summer of 2007. She won this battle and was a cancer survivor for about 12 years, until 2020 when she was diagnosed with Stage IV Lung Cancer. She is preceded in death by her husband Raul Reyes Sr., sisters Maria De Jesus, Maria de Refugio Campos, brothers Manuel Campos, Jose Velez and Juan Velez. She is survived by her children Rebecca L.
