



Marion Pahy

August 13, 1915 - June 25, 2005

Marion Jorgensen Pahy slipped away quietly on June 25, 2005 to be with her husband Daniel and their beautiful Irish Setters who were waiting for her at the Rainbow Bridge.

When living in New Jersey, Marion and Dan were involved in Irish Setters for many years. Her Irish Setter, Faith Farm Lehigh Little Bit, was the First Irish Setter to attain a Field Trial Championship in Texas. Her Faith Farm Cinnamon Toast was the first Irish Setter rescue dog to attain a Junior Hunter title in Texas and the United States. In her last years, her most rewarding work was being a part of a rescue team, helping to find forever homes for Irish Setters who were abandoned or injured.

Early in her professional career, Marion was the personnel director for a large insurance company. She later became the administrative assistant to a United States Senator and assisted him in writing and publishing a book on Ferdinand Magellan, which became a History Book of the Year. During this period of her life, she met many famous people in the political and military world. She was a charter member of the National Secretary Association and the Business & Professional Women's Clubs. During WWII, Marion served as a nurse's aide in several hospitals and worked with charitable organizations. After moving to San Antonio, Marion's interest in books led to her long affiliation with the Great Exchange Bookstore. She felt that people who read were so interesting and had much to offer in life.

Marion leaves a sister-in-law, Evelyne Jorgensen, in Jacksonville, FL.; a

nephew John Daniel Jorgensen of Princeton, New Jersey; a niece Carol Beck, of Everglade City, Fl.; and a niece Bette Okeksey, of Bear, Delaware. She also leaves cousins Inger Ostergaard of Rungsted Kyst, Denmark and Eva Sabroe of Horsholm, Denmark,
