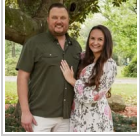

“First, may God shine His perpetual light upon Mark, and blessings and prayers for the Meyer family.

My family moved to San Antonio in 1976 and I attended the middle school grades 6-8 at Holy Spirit and we both graduated from Churchill in 1982. At Holy Spirit Mark was one of the first people to befriend me. Mark was always one of the cool kids and even received the nickname 'The Fonze' after the Winkler biker character from Happy Days. We played on the school's basketball and baseball teams, and Mark even recruited me to play in a tennis tournament even though I had never played tennis, didn't know how to serve, didn't own a racket or have decent tennis shoes. But he spent the time to give me a crash course in tennis. I can remember going over to his house before baseball practice and he would make everyone chocolate shakes. Mark was very athletic and we had some very successful teams. In middle school I was very spontaneous and not always in a good way. One day our 8th grade class was taking a field trip to San Jose Mission. and after awhile I became bored. I told Mark that my paternal grandmother lived nearby and that I wanted to walk over to see her. Mark said it was bad idea and tried to convince me not to do it, but he could not. But Mark said he would accompany me so that I would not be walking by myself. After getting chased by German Shepherds we made it to my grandmother's front door only to have my grandmother tell me I had better get my butt back to the Mission. Mark said I told you so and so we headed back to San Jose where we barely made it back before the bus left to go back to Holy Spirit.

Two things that always stood out about Mark was that he was very genuine, and that he told great stories. Even though sometimes we thought he might be embellishing on some of the details Mark always told the best stories. Mark was a die-hard Aggie fan and wore his Aggie heart on his sleeve and bled maroon and white. Since I was a UT fan we always participated in some good-natured gamesmanship contingent on who won the Thanksgiving Day showdown that year. I can remember in November 1976 the Aggies put a 27-3 beat down on Texas, in Austin, and when I was walking into the classroom that morning Mark started singing "Hullabaloo

Caneck Caneck" and the entire Aggie War Hymn. After high school I would run into Mark at parties occasionally and it was always great to talk to him especially when he was telling a story. I am sure he is up there in Heaven telling more great stories. Rest In Peace Mark.

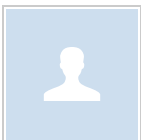
