



Martha Ann Howell Fanning

September 17, 1929 - February 12, 2018

Martha Fanning, loving wife and partner in ministry with her husband, Buckner Fanning, died and was reunited with her husband in heaven on Monday February 12, 2018.

A native of Dallas, Martha Fanning was intimately involved in church from her very first days on earth. She grew up in the First Baptist Church in Dallas and spent most of her time performing in the worship services, both as a soloist and as a member of the choir. She graduated salutatorian from Forest Avenue High School in Dallas and received a four-year scholarship to Southern Methodist University School of Music.

She met her future husband while playing the piano at a Youth Revival service in Dallas and she and Buckner were married at the First Baptist Church in Dallas on June 5, 1949. She and Buckner then spent the next ten years traveling the world doing evangelistic work. In 1959, they accepted a position at Trinity Baptist Church in San Antonio where they ministered for 42 years.

Martha was an accomplished musician who recorded numerous albums. In addition, she co-authored a book with her good friend Millie Cooper entitled "What Every Woman Still Knows." But most of all, she was such an integral and indispensable part of Buckner's evangelistic ministry, and he to her music ministry, that it is impossible to separate the two of them when speaking about

their impact for Christ over 6 decades.

Her greatest joy was having the privilege of serving Christ for her entire life. A very close second was being married to Buckner for over 66 years and partnering with him in ministry for all those years. And last, but not least, she loved her children, their spouses and her grandkids, who will always remember them as their “Mimi and Beau.”
