



## Mary Frances Beeley

April 30, 1924 - August 16, 2017

Frances was the youngest of five McGarrity sisters and was born on April 30, 1924 in San Antonio. She always talked about the good memories she had growing up and how loving her family was. She met her future husband at a party. He was her sister Erin's blind date but by the end of the evening they had switched dates and she left with Bill. They dated until August 1, 1942 when they got married at midnight by a Justice of the Peace. Bill was in the Army Air Corps and the couple lived on a shoestring, moving from one little town in south Texas to another until they were transferred to Puerto Rico. She said there was a mild earthquake the day they arrived but no hurricanes in the three years they were there. Frances was the ultimate "Army" wife, moving from assignment to assignment, always with a positive and forward looking attitude, making the best of every transfer. She was the ultimate Mom, always looking out for her family and friends. Frances volunteered with the Red Cross and she enjoyed bowling. Frances went home to her maker on August 16, 2017 and was preceded in death by her husband, William Charles Beeley. She is survived by her children, Pamela Beeley Ridlehuber, William C. Beeley, II; grandchildren, Jini Tylyn Branson and husband, Will Branson, Travis Taylor Beeley and Jeremy Tate Boots; great-grandchildren, Matthew Branson, Audrey Branson and Ryker Beeley.
