



## Mary Lou Hollan Inman

August 26, 1927 - March 16, 2023

Mary Lou Hollan Inman was born August 26, 1927 and passed away March 16, 2023. She was preceded in death by her parents, Samuel Morgan Hollan and Eula Goode Hollan and by her husband, Calvin Marion Inman.

She is survived by seven nieces and nephews and their spouses: Milesa and Sam Quraini, Brenda and Lynn Davis, Dan and Mary Johnson, Roger and Amy Johnson, Brad and Brenda Johnson, Jeff and Connie Johnson, Jana and Brad Jensen; twenty-one great nieces and nephews, five great great nieces and six great great nephews, several cousins and many dear friends.

Mary was born in Yoakum, Texas where she grew up and graduated from high school with the class of 1944. She graduated from Baldwin's Business College in 1945 and attended the University of Texas in Austin. She worked in Victoria, Texas for the DuPont Company during the construction of their plant there. Mutual friends in Victoria introduced her to Calvin Inman, who became the love of her life and best friend. They were married there February 7, 1953. Cal's company transferred him to San Antonio later that year and they lived there for the rest of their lives.

Mary received her B.A. Degree from Trinity University and M.A. from Incarnate Word. She taught biology at Jefferson High School and was the librarian at

Horace Mann Middle School. Cal taught Journalism at Holmes High School, and they both retired in 1987. They loved to travel and were able to visit most of the places in the world that they wanted to see. They built a cabin in the Black Hills of South Dakota and spent at least a part of the summer there every year. They celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in 2003 with parties in San Antonio and in the Black Hills. Cal died in 2007, one week before their anniversary. A few years later Mary moved to Patriot Heights retirement community where she lived for the rest of her life.
