World War II Veteran, Matias Ramos, Jr. born September 4, 1925, (92 years old) formerly of Laredo, Texas. Mr. Ramos touched the lives of everyone he met. His friendly demeanor, smile, sense of humor, and charisma were magnetic. He radiated goodness and kindness to all. He truly loved life and treasured his wife, children, and relatives to the fullest. He was a great friend, mentor, and father. Mr. & Mrs. Ramos humbly led a Christ-centered life and instilled that virtue in their family.

While living in Laredo, Texas Matias noticed the most beautiful woman, Mirta Rodriguez, and immediately knew one day she would become his wife. Matias and Mirta married on September 14, 1942 and started their family. They were married for 58 years and had 9 children. He enlisted into the US Marine Corps valiantly serving in combat in the front lines of the Pacific during WWII in Guadalcanal, Palau, and Okinawa from 1944-1946. After returning from the war, he accepted a position with the US Department of Agriculture and began his lifelong career as a Federal Meat and Compliance Officer. It was at that time, he relocated his family from Laredo to San Antonio, Texas. Some of his

greatest accomplishments while in the USDA were introducing and passing several USDA laws which are still in effect today. He proudly served the USDA department for over 30 years.

Mr. Ramos was an avid hunter and fisherman: his sporting travels took him to Colorado, New Mexico, Alaska, and Canada. His love and wisdom is personified by the legacy he leaves behind.

He was predeceased in death by his wife, Mirta Rodriguez Ramos, and two of his children, Matias Ramos III and Elsa Ramos Hubbard. He is survived by seven of his children, Javier Ramos, Mirta (Steve) Jackson, Lisa (Jeff) Pryor, Martha (Richard) Timm, Jerry Ramos, Gabriela (David) Sierra, Annel (Rick) Reyes, and his sister Berta Valdez; 19 grandchildren, 28 great-grandchildren, and 1 great-great grandchild.
