Maxine Conner Oldham, 75, passed over into the arms of the Lord on November 20, 2013 in San Antonio.

Maxine was born September 30, 1938 in San Antonio to Homer and Elizabeth Conner. She was part of a military family and lived in various parts of the world such as Washington State and Japan Her family resettled back in San Antonio in the 1950s and she graduated from Edison High School in 1957. When she returned to San Antonio, she re-connected with her childhood sweetheart and future husband, James.

Family meant everything to Maxine. She was a devoted wife, loving mother, and known for her selflessness to the people she came in contact with. Her philosophy of "having fun" as a bowling coach transformed the lives of the kids she "adopted". Maxine and Jim, at their expense, would transport kids to local tournaments and other places throughout Texas and the United States. She was often called "mom" because she provided the love, care, and opportunities that otherwise may not have been possible. As a testament to her character, her "adoptees" and their kids would often visit her home and share their fondest bowling memories.

Beyond bowling, she enjoyed her 1928 Chevy, loved spending times with her animals, and travel with Jim in her RV.
