Michael Edward “Mike” Heaviland, aged 78, passed into eternity on February 15, 2018, after bravely battling a lengthy illness. He was a faithful servant and remained active in Christian service ministering to others with an active prayer ministry and his many administrative talents. Always the committed disciple, he served faithfully at many churches, most recently at Word Fellowship Church in Cibolo, Texas.
