On February 19, 2021, Michael A. Herrejon went to rest in Christ Jesus and eternal life in God's Kingdom. He was born to Faustino S. and Raquel C. Herrejon (both deceased) on February 23, 1962. He is preceded in death by his brothers, Luis Antonio, Armando, and sister, Maria Teresa (Tere)Tello.

Michael was the proud owner of Old Mexico Imports at Market Square, a business his Father and Mother first started in the early 1960s. It was a business that provided his older brothers businesses of their own, also at Market Square. Working from a very young age with his father, this was the only job Michael worked in, later becoming the sole business owner when his father passed away in 2005. Learning what his father taught him, he became just as successful and skilled at developing new ideas in merchandising, buying and selling, working with many vendors that sought to do business with him.

Michael also took his business to the online platform like Facebook, where followers would become customers, leaving stellar reviews and positive comments, not only on his customer service or products, but also on the lively Christian music that was always playing in the shop. Michael worked with great diligence, ongoing determination, and endless perseverance in his business, the same way he lived his life, committed and devoted to his faith in

God. He believed God was always with him, leading him and guiding him, never wavering from sharing scriptures with customers or workers. He believed it was God's purpose for him to minister to people at every opportunity, including his father.

One evening, Michael and his father watched the film, *The Passion of the Christ*. While watching the film, Faustino became incredibly moved by the story of Christ, that this moment lent itself for Michael to minister to his father and lead him to salvation. Michael's tastes were "Old School" in a variety of things like the Disco era, particularly Donna Summer. He enjoyed classic movies from the TCM channel and musicals such as *Singing in the Rain*, classic television shows like "I Love Lucy" and his all time favorite "The Carol Burnett Show." He thoroughly enjoyed the comedy series' *Friends*, *Frasier* and that other one "where everybody knows your name."

Michael is survived by his sister Elva H. Dougan, brother Carlos C. Herrejon (Rhonda), sister Rachel H. Stephens (Tom), brother Jaime C. Herrejon (Connie), and brother Eddie C. Herrejon, bother-in-law Ed Tello and numerous nieces and nephews who loved their Tio Michael very much. He will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his nieces and nephews. Their memories of trips to the movies with him, trips to the video stores, going through his collection of vinyl records, his delicious fideo, his homemade tuna salad, his jokes, his easy going, loving, confident, and heartwarming laughter will dearly be missed and always in our hearts.

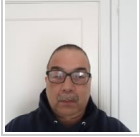
