Milan Brezacek, known as Breezie to many of his friends and family, was born on June 26, 1920 in Omaha, NE. He died at the age of 94 on September 24, 2014 in San Antonio, TX.

Milan was an avid swimmer. He was on his high school swim team and worked as a lifeguard during high school and college.

He served in the US Army during WW II, first as a psychological assistant in induction stations, then as a medic in the infantry in Europe during the last days of the war and as part of the Occupation Army in Germany.

After his discharge in January 1946, he worked in his parents' seed store. Milan went to school in the evenings and received a bachelor's degree from UNO in 1955.

He worked for Omaha Public Power District for 31 years and retired in 1983.

During his retirement, he enjoyed traveling, playing golf, photography, attending 70th Division Army reunions, and being with his grandchildren and

great grandchildren.

He was an avid Nebraska Cornhuskers football fan.

In 2003, Milan and his wife moved to San Antonio to be near his older daughter and her family. He became a Spurs fan, of course.

Milan was preceded in death by his wife, Libbie. He is survived by daughters, Deanne Hammer Larry of San Antonio, Janice Erickcek George of Kalamazoo, MI, and son Richard Brezacek Laura of Bremerton, WA. Milan was "Grandpa Breezie" to five grandchildren and six great grandchildren. His grandchildren included Greg Hammer, Cheri Hammer DeLane, Amy Brezacek Jackson, Adrienne Erickcek, and Franci Brezacek. His great grandchildren were Nathan and Maya Hammer, Sydney and Dylan Jackson, and Zachary and Claire DeLane.

The funeral service will be held at Mission Park Funeral Chapels North on Saturday, October 4, 2014 at 3:00 PM.

Milan's cremated remains will be interred along with Libbie's in an Omaha cemetery at a later date.
