



Naomi Rodriguez Ortega

February 21, 1928 - June 18, 2023

Naomi Ortega, age 94 was born August 21, 1928 in Dilley, Texas and went home peacefully to be with the Lord June 18, 2023 at her residence.

Her parents were: Ezequiel and Andrea Rodriguez. She grew up in Dilley, Texas until she married her husband Abel Ortega of Austin, Texas where she then lived. Later, she moved to San Antonio and resided there for over thirty years until she and her husband Abel moved to Cibolo, Texas to be closer to family. Naomi and Abel were married 62 years before he went home to be with the Lord. She was so proud of her husband Abel who was a former POW for 3 ½ years in WWII and also fought in the Korean war.

She was a dedicated Christian who loved the Lord and didn't mind telling others about Jesus. She was a member of MacArthur Park Church of Christ. Naomi retired from the State of Texas after 35 years of dedicated service. Her career consisted as an EKG technician and later the secretary to the Chief of Staff at the State TB Hospital in San Antonio.
