Nardi's attended St. Philip of Jesus Catholic School. There, he acquired his leadership skills as a boy scout of America troop number 91 in 1954. He attended Brackenridge High School, and then joined the service.

Nardi loved family life. He was the third from the oldest, and throughout the years, he constantly watched over all twelve of his brothers and sisters and their families. There was no problem he could not solve and he was always there to lend a hand. He was the pillar of the Medina family.

With the closing of Kelly AFB, Nardi retired.

Nardi had a great sense of humor and was always quick with a comeback. He

enjoyed get-togethers and meeting new friends. The ROSS Senior Center was a happy place for him and his wife Hope. They gathered there with numerous friends for lunch and would take occasional short trips around Texas. He was well known at the Ross Center, always mischievous and playfully teasing anyone. He loved hearing the sounds of the old county western tunes.

Nardi met his wife Hope Solis in San Antonio, TX. They were married in Seguin TX on October on 10/14/1980. They had 37 wonderful years of marriage until 11/5/2016, when Hope passed away. They had no children, but, Nardi considered every child linked with the family, his own.

Nardelio became a member of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, in Alzafar temple of San Antonio TX, he received the Scottish rite degrees on 6/22/1974 including the 32nd degree, an accomplishment he was very proud to have achieved.

He is preceded in death by his parents and three brothers, Joe Jr., Ralph and Santos Medina. He is survived by two brothers, Alejandro (Diana) and Jesse (Charlotte) Medina.
