Norma Jean Cushing Jackson was born July 19, 1932, to James Cushing, Jr. and Carrie Ethel Unfred Cushing in Washington County, Kansas, Kimeo Township. She passed on from this life to eternal glory on June 20, 2024. Norma was born in the homestead farmhouse that her grandfather, James Cushing, Sr., built and the same house her father was born in. She was the tenth child of her parents who had thirteen children.

Norma received The Lord Jesus Christ as her Savior and was baptized in 1943.

She attended Chapman Rural School from 1939-1943. From 1944 to 1951 she attended public schools in Greenleaf, KS, Washington County. She graduated from high school in 1951. From 1951 to 1955 she was employed by the Washington County Welfare Office in Washington, KS. From 1955 to 1957 she attended Manhattan Bible College in Manhattan, KS. She worked at a laundry and cleaning business one summer in Manhattan, KS. She worked at the Horton Garment Factory in Atchison, KS 1957-1958. Norma worked for the Department of Human Services of the State of Texas in San Antonio, Texas from 1979 to 1995 a total of sixteen years.

On June 1, 1958, Norma married Pastor James Warren Jackson at the Christian Church, Greenleaf, Kansas. They lived in the following locations: Farmington (pastored at Cummings, KS also), KS; Mankato, KS; Fowler, KS; and San Antonio, Texas.

She was a devoted wife, mother, aunt, grandmother and great-grandmother.
