Norma P. Taylor died in San Antonio, Texas, on February 14, 2010. She will be buried, with a graveside service in Bear Creek Cemetery, Bertram, Texas, at 2pm on February 18, 2010. Request all contributions be made to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Bertram, Texas.

Norma Mary Patterson was born March 5, 1921, to Norman J. and Susie Macaulay Patterson in West Springfield, Hampden County, Massachusetts. Norma was raised in West Springfield and graduated from West Springfield High School in 1939 and from the Westbrook Junior College, Portland, Maine, in 1941.

Shortly after graduation, she was employed by the Forbes & Wallace Department Store in Springfield, Massachusetts, as a buyer for women's clothing. She remained with this company until she married Dayton R. Taylor at Tyndall Field, Panama City, Florida, on October 8, 1948. As "D.R." was a professional Air Force officer, she began her military experience the next 21 years. After a four year tour in Europe, they returned to the U.S. in 1964 and completed their military career after an assignment at the Pentagon, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, on August 1, 1969.

Norma and D.R. retired in Austin, Texas, in 1969, where he was employed with the Texas Education Agency in the Finance Department for 10 years. In 2009 they relocated to San Antonio, Texas, where they resided at the Home Residences – Shavano Park.

Norma and D.R. had two children: a son, Norman Bain Taylor, and a daughter,

Susan Vaughan Taylor Bufkin. As D.R. had a son, Robert Reed Taylor, by previous marriage, Bob was quickly integrated into the D.R. Taylor family.
