Olga and Rogelio loved to visit their son, daughter-in-law, and grandchildren in Colorado, as well as extended family in California, Mexico, and Guatemala. Olga loved her close circle so dearly that she was known for her long goodbyes, great interest in the lives of those around her, and handwritten cards and notes. Her loved ones will always cherish the memory of her infectious laugh. Olga especially loved to watch Spurs games and call her comadres and family to discuss them, enjoy spaghetti dinners with her family, visit the beach with her family and walk barefoot in the sand, and wear her most fashionable attire, most especially her favorite color purple.
