She went to St. Martins Hall for grade school where she played clarinet in the band and was on the honor roll. She graduated from Providence High School in 1957 and attended Our Lady of the Lake College for 2 years.

In 1959 she married Donald Brundrett. They spent the first few years in Leon Valley where Kathleen was born in 1961 and Robert in 1963. Don went on active duty in the Air Force for pilot training and Kenneth was born in Selma, Alabama in 1965 at the height of the civil rights movement and the march on Selma. They returned to Leon Valley (San Antonio) and Laura was born in 1967. 1968 found them moving to Richardson Texas where Don flew for Braniff. They eventually settled in Patti's dream house in Lewisville where she gardened, decorated, sewed and was involved in the community, St Phillip the

Apostle Catholic Church and the kid's activities.

Life takes many turns and in 1983 Patti began a new chapter in her life. Finding herself a single Mom she began her career as a travel agent. She bought her garden home on Berridge Lane in Dallas.
