



## Patrick Shannon Bogan

Patrick Shannon Bogan left this world on June 11, 2020. Born on March 11, 1957, in Chicago, Illinois to Robert Francis Bogan and Joyce Louise Quinn Bogan, Pat grew up in Lake Forest, Illinois and suburban Kansas City.

Patrick is survived by his son, Mr. Sean Michael Bogan; sister, Mrs. Aletha Bogan Evert; nephews LCDR Jason Andrew Evert (USN); LT Travis Michael Evert (USN); step-daughter, Mrs. Joy Renee Demunck, and her children, Orion, Aurora and Ethereal.

Patrick was very generous in thoughts, words and deeds. He appreciated beauty in all its forms, especially music and poetry. He treated Joy's children as his own grandchildren, staying involved in their lives despite the physical distance from New Mexico. Known as Grandpa Pat, Ethereal claims he was the "Best grandpa ever!"

Having developed his love of dogs when growing up with three golden retrievers, throughout his adult life Patrick loved and cared for a menagerie of different breeds – mostly rescues.

Patrick served in the U.S. Army from 1981 to 1984 and again from 1986 to 1990, achieving the rank of sergeant before his honorable discharge. Pat was a medical specialist in his first enlistment and became an M1 Abrams Tank System mechanic in his second. His military service postings included US Army Garrison Hanau, Germany; Fort Knox, Kentucky; Forts Benning and Stewart in Georgia; Fort Bliss, Texas; and Fort Greely, Alaska, as well as tank exercises in Turkey. Patrick earned the Army Achievement Medal and the

Army Commendation Medal among other awards over the course of his enlistments.

When he wasn't in the Army, Patrick worked at various jobs including golf course grounds keeper, grocery delivery driver, and security guard. His longer-term residences included Oklahoma City; Tybee Island, Georgia; and Las Vegas.

Patrick moved from Las Vegas to San Antonio in 2010 to help care for his aging and ailing parents. After his father died in 2012, Patrick gained his sister's eternal gratitude for continuing to care for his mother until she passed away in 2019.
