Paul Glendon Jordan died peacefully at age 85 on Wednesday, December 19, 2007 at his home surrounded by family and friends after a 3 year battle with cancer. Born on October 15, 1922 in Granola, Kansas he was a veteran of World War II in the Merchant Marines. His love of boats and the water continued his entire life. "He was a sailor, carpenter and craftsmen with dreams." His greatest accomplishment and happiest time was completely restoring a 1934 Wheeler, originally built in the Brooklyn Shipyard of New York, that had been caught in a 1960's hurricane . After 25 years of restoration he finally launched her in 1990 with the help of family and friends and to the delight of many onlookers. Paul is survived by his loving wife Nila June Yount Jordan; children, Linda, Paul Rane and Susan, 6 grandchildren; 13 great grandchildren; a sister, Ginger Blair; and nieces and nephews.
