



Paulette Gallois Pell

September 28, 1925 - December 22, 2022

Paulette Gallois Pell passed away peacefully in her sleep on December 22, 2022 in New Braunfels, Texas. She was born on September 28, 1925 in Paris, France. Mrs. Pell was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Colonel Claude "Corky" Pell; her parents and her sister, Simone. She is survived by her niece, Christine Van Roggen; and her dear friends, Richard and Susan Perry. Paulette met Corky in 1945 on a blind date arranged by her sister. They were married that same year in Paris. Corky left for the states in April 1946 and Paulette followed as a war bride in May 1946. After he retired from the Army in 1969, they returned to Germany and he worked as a civilian for the U.S. Army for another 6 1/2 years. They were proficient ballroom dancers and taught round dancing all over Europe for those years. Both were big supporters of the American Square Dance movement in Europe. They left Germany in 1976 and resided in San Antonio for the rest of their lives. They established a round dance club in San Antonio and continued teaching and dancing throughout the states. A graveside service will be held on Friday, January 6, 2023 at 10:00am at Ft. Sam Houston National Cemetery, Shelter #1.
