Philip LeRoy Jones- A pastor to hundreds, a mentor too many, and a friend to all went to be with the Lord on Monday, July 26, 2021 at the age of 86 years. Philip was born on April 27, 1935 in Kidder, Missouri to LeRoy and Cornelia (Tuttle) Jones. He grew up and went to school in Hamilton, Missouri where he graduated in 1952. Phil married his high school sweetheart Phyllis Moss. Four children were born to this union. Phil later married Phyllis Beashore, with one son and daughter born into this union. Phil served in the United States Army both stateside and in Korea in 1961, where he received various commendations. Returning to the states and completing his Army career. Phil worked with his parents and brother in the entertainment industry in several states and in San Antonio for a few years. Phil converted to the Lord in the early 70's and started his calling to the ministry at Castle Hills First Baptist Church. Pastor Phil served the Lord for most of his adult life. His ministry of spreading God's Word reached thousands with mission trips to India, Mexico, Africa, Central America and Haiti. Pastor Phil Founded The New Testament Church and Learning Academy in San Antonio in the early 80's. Dedicating the rest of his life to spreading God's word no matter the time or place.
