Phil was born in San Antonio, Texas to Paul and Lorene Williams in 1932.

Phil and his wife, Mary Ann, met in the 7th grade at Harlandale Jr. High School. In High School, Phil earned a golf scholarship to the University of Texas; however, he was called into active duty in the Air Force during the Korean War before he could take advantage of that scholarship. Phil joined the Air Force Reserves as a Junior in High School, graduated in 1950 and was called into active duty in 1951. He married his High School Sweetheart, Mary Ann Wilks, in June of 1951.

Golf was always a huge part of his life. He spent hours after school caddying at Riverside Golf Course. Phil's accomplishments in the sport include 8 hole in ones in his lifetime. At the age of 16 he tied the Riverside Golf Course record. He won 1st Place in 7 Riverside tournaments. After his time in the service he became the Golf Pro at the Beeville Country Club and the 7 Oaks Country Club before going to work for United Insurance Company and becoming District Manager. He worked for Sunglo Fina Gas & Oil for 24 years becoming V.P. and General Manager and later owning 3 convenience stores of his own before retiring.

In retirement he played golf with a group called "The Good Ole Boys" at the Flying L Ranch in Bandera, Texas every week.

Phil also loved to spend time in Leakey, Texas on the Frio River with his family and friends.

Phil was preceded in death by his father Paul Albert Williams, his mother Lorene Williams (Jesse Lorene O'Brien Williams) and his brother Paul Wilfred "Billy Paul" Williams. He is survived by his wife of 69 years, Mary Ann Wilks Williams, daughters Brenda Williams Logue, Patricia Williams, and Melissa Williams Moritz (Shannon). Granddaughters Taylor Williams (David Woznica) and Megan Moritz and great granddaughters Adison, Emma, and Everly.

Always positive and oh so kind, Phil always made us smile. He will be dearly missed but he knew the Lord and we know we'll see him again one day.
