Rachel Padilla King, age 65, born in San Antonio, Texas on November 29, 1943, quietly passed away in the late morning on February 26, 2009 surrounded by her family.

In the fall of 2007, doctors diagnosed Rachel with late stage kidney cancer and advised that she may only have months left to live. But, as was the case throughout her life, Rachel would not be told what to do or when to do it. She was a strong willed woman of faith who battled the disease courageously and, with the love and care of her loyal husband, Charles King, she spent her last year in this world enjoying the company of family and friends. Although retired as a school teacher many years earlier, Rachel, nevertheless, continuously taught all those around her.

Rachel was a faithful member of the Catholic Church and a follower of Christ her entire life. As a child, she attended St Henry's church regularly with her family. In more recent years, she was an active parishioner at both St Cecilia and St Anthony Mary Claret. She volunteered her time to serve as a Eucharistic minister, delivering the Holy Eucharist to the sick and homebound, and was a member of the Legion of Mary. And, she consistently supported her husband in his service as a Deacon.

Rachel is preceded in death by her parents, Joe G. and Amelia Padilla, sister, Rosie "PeeWee" Rodriguez, and niece, Debbie Rodriguez. She is survived by her loving husband, Charles King; brother, Joe E. "Tito" Padilla; son, Raymond Cosme and wife Annabelle; son, Gabriel Cosme; daughter, Christina Cosme and husband Kenneth Ruthardt; grandchildren, Jacob and Brianna; niece and nephew, Yvonne and Clifford John Rodriguez; and several other extended family members.
