As a young adult, she and her girlfriend enjoyed going to the movies and where she met her future husband who was in the service during WWII. They courted for a while and soon after he asked for her hand in marriage.

Rae then became one of those war brides as there were so many at the time getting married during the war. She raised 5 children in her life time. After the war, she went to work for Joske's department store. In her spare time, she loved baking all kinds of goodies for her family. Sewing was her hobby; she would sew clothing for her children. As money was tight in those days.

She was always busy doing something but never too busy to give her children a hug now and then. Once she retired from the department store, she took up gardening and enjoying being out of doors in the fresh air. She also started selling Avon products that a friend introduced her to.

She would go out door to door selling Avon products making friends along the way. As the years went by, her health slowly declined due to the onset of Parkinson's disease. In time, it took her inability to walk and the disease also brought on dementia. Toward the end of her life the dementia robbed her of

her memory and of her love ones.

The disease ended her life on December 25th the day of our Lord's birth. The legacy she leaves behind of her family are 11grandchildren, 32 great grandchildren, 2 great, great grandchildren and the irony of this story, is she lost her youngest son five days earlier on December 20th of the same horrible disease which also took his life. And now they are united together in Heaven.
