



Ramon V. Quintero

December 7, 1920 - May 14, 2021

Ramon V. Quintero went to be with the Lord on May 14, 2021, at the age of 100. He was born on December 7, 1920 in Waco, TX. As a child, the family traveled to Michigan as migrant workers. They later moved to Creedmoor, TX and opened a grocery store where Ramon also helped out. In the late 1930's the family moved to San Antonio where he still resided. Ramon joined the military in May of 1941 during World War II and was stationed in the Fiji Islands as a chemical warfare specialist. Prior to being released from the Army he was stationed in Denver, Colorado where he met and married Josephine Villa. The two of them were married for 55 years and had 13 children. Ramon was self-employed and continued working until the late 1970's. It was at this time that he focused his time and energy on improving his neighborhood. He was a member of the Sunny Slope Association, Highland Park Association, and was appointed to the Make San Antonio Beautiful Committee. Ramon was instrumental in pushing for drains, gutters, sidewalks, and improving the streets in the Sunny Slope Neighborhood. In the 1980's he helped plant shrubs and flowers as well as bringing more activities to Highland Park. Ramon played a very active role campaigning for numerous local elected officials and received numerous awards from the House of Representatives and the City of San Antonio. He was very active and well know throughout his community. He was a member of the Bill Miller's Buddies Club, he loved baseball and his Dallas Cowboys.

He is preceded in death by his wife, Josephine V. Quintero; parents, Ramon and Ricarda Quintero; children, Ramon, Jesse, Maria Luisa, Herlinda, Reynaldo and Richard Quintero; siblings, Marcelo Quintero, Sulema Contreras, Manuela Reyes, Esther Casillas and Maria Anastacia Olguin. Ramon is survived by his loving children, Robert Quintero (Helen), Rudolph Quintero, Gilda Castillo (Manuel), Rafael Quintero (Todocia), Rosendo Quintero (Maryjane), Ruben Quintero and Marie Herrera (Frank); sister, Elvira Zuniga; 27 grandchildren, 70 great-grandchildren, 63 great-great-grandchildren and numerous nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.

Visitation will be Wednesday, May 26, 2021 from 5:30 to 8:00 p.m. with a Rosary to be recited at 6:30 p.m. at Mission Park South. Funeral procession will depart the funeral home at 9:30 a.m. on Thursday, May 27th for a Funeral Mass at 10:00 a.m. St. Margaret Mary Catholic Church. Services will conclude at the church and interment will take place at a later date at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery.
