Raymond Wesley Menefee was born on September 18, 1917 in Granbury, Texas and passed away, peacefully, on May 16th, 2008 in San Antonio, at the age of 90 years, from respiratory failure. He graduated from Granbury High School and enlisted in the Civil Construction Corp, based in Grand Junction, Colorado in 1936. Ray joined the U.S. Army in 1940, and served in ETO during World War II for 5 years. He was employed as a Civil Service worker engineer for Lackland A.F.B. for 38 years. Ray served as a Scout Master for the Boy Scouts of America and was a member of the Masonic Lodge for over 60 years. He was also a member of the Cokesbury United Methodist Church and the University United Methodist Church. He was preceded in death by his wife, Dora Lee Menefee; and his daughter, Donna Louise Rice. He leaves behind his wife of 16 years, Bonnie Menefee and a brother, Robert Menefee, and three children, Mike Menefee and wife Kathy, John Menefee and wife Gay Lynn, Vivian Jenkins and husband Bill, Les Ueckert and wife Joan, Judd Ueckert and wife Denise; eleven grandchildren, Melissa Margeson and husband Aaron, Mike Menefee, Jr. and wife Amy, Travis Menefee, Justin Martin and wife Bobbie, B.J.
