Raymond Harris Wills of San Antonio passed away on March 18, 2014, at the age of 83. His integrity and commitment to education was evident in the many lives he touched throughout his life. As he told his students, "May you face each day with a feeling of responsibility to become an educated individual willing to work for something a little bit bigger than yourself. Just remember, the
