



Reuben B. Lott, Jr.

March 17, 1925 - March 26, 2020

Reuben B. Lott Jr., age 95, went to be with the Lord on March 26, 2020. He was born in San Antonio, TX to Reuben & Magdalena Lott on March 17, 1925. He was preceded in death by his parents and two eldest sisters Zanie Edwards Giese and Rhoda Williamson Dunlap. He is survived by his wife of 73 years, Erldene Wagner Lott, and his 4 children, Robert Lott (Vickie), James Lott (Eva), Steven Lott, Cynthia Lott Hill (Kelly); 7 grandchildren; 8 great grandchildren; and 1 sister, Riller "Ruth" Willoughby (Frank).

Reuben was drafted into the Army at the age of 18. He served in the European Theatre in World War II from March 1943 - March 1946 and was reactivated during the Korean War, then serving in the U.S. Air Force. After returning from WWII, he worked at Kelly AFB until his retirement in 1980.

Reuben took an active part in his children's lives and in the community not just joining organizations but quite often being voted President of those organizations. He was President of the Palm Heights Little League, the Jeff Davis Middle School PTA, Sam Houston Band Boosters, and the Bexar County Sheriff Reserves. He was a member of the Bexar County Sheriff Reserves for 23 years. Following his retirement from Kelly AFB he served as Head of Security at St. Luke's Lutheran Hospital.

Reuben felt that he had a calling to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Though he was never ordained he did preach the Gospel, teach the Gospel, and share the Gospel in pulpits, in Sunday School classes, and with individuals across San Antonio, South Texas, and wherever he went. He was also the first Sunday School Superintendent to a very young Reverend John Hagee. For the past 40 years he has been an active member of Calvary Temple Assembly of God Church.

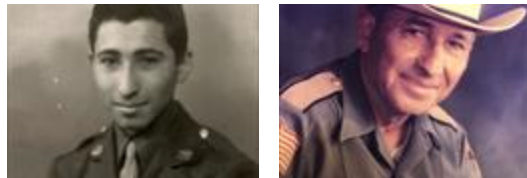
