January 30, 1914 - November 27, 2005

FATHER THOMAS A. KAVANAUGH Father Thomas Kavanaugh entered eternal life Nov. 27, 2005 at the age of 91. Father Tom, a native of Chicago, Illinois, was born on Jan. 30, 1914. In 1935 he made his Religious Profession in the Congregation of the Missions Vincentians and was ordained a priest in June, 1941. Following ordination Father Tom was sent on "temporary assignment" to San Antonio, Texas where he remained for 64 years. For 27 of those years Father Tom's ministered at St. John's and Assumption seminaries where he was professor and spiritual director of formation for numerous young men who were studying for the priesthood. Father Tom was very instrumental in fostering the importance of learning Spanish language and culture. During the remainder of his Texas tenure Father Tom served the people of God through parish ministry in St. Leo, Sacred Heart Cotulla, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, Immaculate Conception El Paso, Our Lady of Grace, and St. Matthew SA where he was actively engaged until his hospitalization on November 2nd. Father Tom is preceded in death by his parents, John and Josephine, his brother John and his wife, Jeanne and his niece, Mary Jo Berg and her husband, Tom. He is survived by nieces and nephews, Richard Kavanaugh and his wife, Geri; Thomas Kavanaugh and his wife, Cheryl; Patricia Kavanaugh; John Kavanaugh and his wife, Patricia; Jeanne Kavanaugh; Margo Kavanaugh Potekin and her husband, Barry, and Katherine Brennan and her husband, Mike.
