



## Rex G. Lee Sr.

April 26, 1933 - October 12, 2022

Rex G. Lee, Sr. went to be with the Lord on October 12, 2022, at the age of 89. He was born on April 26, 1933, in Fairfax, Missouri, and later moved to Rockport. Shortly after the time of his birth, his parents, Lagusta H. Lee and Pearl I. Davenport Lee preceded him in death. He is also preceded in death by his brother Gus as well as his longtime friend, Marian Patricia Webb and Laurie Yoder. Rex is survived by his children: Annette May (Daniel May) and Rex Lee II (Christine Lee); grandchildren Eric May, Amanda Yarberry, Rex Lee III and Catalina; six great-grandchildren: Micah, Madison, Millie, Macy, Lucy and 2-month-old Penny Lee (his namesake), as well as Patricia Hemme. Rex is also survived by many friends and will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved him.

The Boys & Girls Club of Springfield, Missouri became a safe haven for him during his childhood, and he contributed generously to their cause up until his death. He was also a past member of The Fraternal Order of Elk's, and participated in the San Antonio Chapter Elk's Lodge. Rex completed high school and adamantly believed that his classes in typing and public speaking gave him the skills he needed to succeed in life. During Rex's early adulthood he entered into the Air Force in June 1951, in Kansas City, Missouri, where he served for 4 years. He received a National Service Defense Medal and a Good Conduct Medal, from Lackland Air Force Base in 1954. His most significant duty was in the 3700th Mtr Veh SQ (ATC). After his military service,

Rex went to work for the Texas Highway Dept., where he worked his way up to Chief Inspector. After his retirement from the T.H.D, he enjoyed teaching Driver's Education classes, as an instructor, and assisting his longtime friend, Patricia with her San Antonio ranch.

Rex's favorite hobbies were bowling, traveling, and spending time with his family. Rex never missed a grandchild's birthday party. He was very sentimental about important family events, and made it known that he was very proud of his children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. His memory and sharp mental acuity was amazing, even at age 89.

Rex was an avid bowler and traveled in bowling competitions where he achieved several 700 series games and received a 700 series ring. He enjoyed traveling all over the U.S. in his R.V. in his later years, especially to Rockport, Missouri, where he attended his annual high school reunion, and revisited the church where he was baptized.

He also became interested in R.V. 's, because of his love for the great outdoors. He loved hiking and exploring. He became part owner and manager of an R.V. Resort Park in Big Spring, TX., with his lifelong friend, Patricia. This became a successful business adventure. In his later years, you could also find him riding around on his golf cart with his grandchildren and 6 great-grandchildren at the R.V. Park where he resided in Bulverde, TX.

Rex was indeed an animal lover. Rex peacefully went to the Lord sitting in his favorite chair in his R.V., surrounded by the horses, donkeys, cattle, cardinals, raccoons, and squirrels whom he fed and took care of everyday. He lived a long and productive life, and was very much loved. He will be greatly missed.
