Richard Allan Cudworth passed away peacefully on February 22nd at the age of 90. He was born in Lowell Massachusetts on July 14, 1919. A 58 year survivor of laryngeal cancer first diagnosed at age 32, he was successfully treated with radiation therapy. A recurrence in 1988 resulted in laryngectomy surgery. He then became a member of the Methodist Hospital Bluebird Auxiliary and volunteered in escort service for more than 10 years. He was an Army veteran of WWII and upon his retirement from civil service was head of the Army Audio Visual Department at Ft. Sam Houston. He devoted his time to pursuing his hobbies: photography, bird watching and traveling in the US and Canada including visiting all of the National Parks. He was a member of the San Antonio Audubon Society and a Charter member of the Mitchell Lake Wetlands Society. A lover of classical music, Richard was a founding member of radio station KPAC. Richard was preceded in death by his beloved daughter Lois and sister Louise Cogan and brother James A. Cudworth. He is survived by his devoted wife of 67 years Rita and son in-law Harry Diakoff and by a loving family of in-laws, nieces and nephews. Our deepest gratitude is extended to the staff at Parklane West for their care and compassion these past five years. Visitation will be held Saturday, February 27, 2010 at Mission Park Funeral Chapels North from 2:00P.M to 5:00P.M.
