Richard E. Dean, age 71, passed away November 24, 2006 in San Antonio. He was born February 2, 1935 in Houston, Texas. His parents, who preceded him in death, were David G. Dean and Antoinette Thames Dean. He graduated from Lamar High School in Houston and Baylor University, in Waco in 1958. He served in the military in 1958 and was called up again in 1961 during the Berlin crisis of that era. His career in insurance claims spanned 30 plus years with the last 25 years in the claims division at USAA, San Antonio, retiring in December 1991. He is survived by his wife, Lois Pride Dean; two sons, Richard "Eddy" Jr, and wife Sharon and Victor B. Dean; two grandsons, Brandon and Dustin, all of which reside in Dallas.
