“ Dear Richard and Vazquez family,
I just received this notice of Cayo’s death from my niece Jojo, Rey Vasquez’s daughter. I always wondered how he got that nickname. I was saddened but overjoyed to have know you as a kid and always remembered you. You are so fresh in my memories and all of your family also, Tito and Mary Lou and Roberto.
We were all classmates at Christ The King Elementary School. I can see you clearly as a young boy in your uniform with the red CKS patch and tie - you were always so neat in appearance - starched shirt, so clean, so gentle quiet and humble, so smart, and so kind. You always had a smile on your face. Your older brother Tito was Rey’s friend and Mary Lou was Rachel’s, my sister’s, friend. Richard we were in the same class and Robert was after. I defended Robert as a kid. I used to go to your house as a kid on Travis St. (2800 block?2803?) - I thought your house was great! Wasn’t it 2-stories? You even had a sidewalk in front of it. I remember your mother - such good, wholesome memories - your big family and your funny sibling interactions. And we both were “Vasquez”.
We lost contact since I left SA but I always heard about you through my brother Rey, your brother Tito, my brother Victor, and now my niece, Jojo, Rey’s daughter. I last talked to Tito at my brother’s funeral in 2013, he lived near my brother and had a barber shop on Guadalupe St. I really appreciated talking to him then I felt comforted about my brother Rey and the memories - such a good friendship we all had - a true caring bond and connection. We were /are like family. So my heart is touched on hearing of this loss but I’m glad I always admired Richard and all of you. You are probably first hearing about this now. He has always lived, along with all of you, as the freshest clearest good memories in my mind. Richard will always live in my memories - as a nice, smart, quiet, polite, well-mannered young man.
