Robert Harold Glass, 90, passed away Sunday, August 10, 2008. He is survived by his wife, Beatriz, and his four sons, Robert, Samuel, Shaun, and Stephen. Born in Springfield, Ohio, on November 9, 1917, he served in Europe with the Army Air Corps during World War II. Traveling widely after the War while working for the Army Air Force Exchange Service, he lived in Hong Kong, Japan, the Philippines, Hawaii, and Europe. He moved to San Antonio in 1972. He loved animals and was an avid bowler. A Master Mason for over 50 years, he was a member of the Grand Lodge F & AM of Ohio Beaver Valley No. 753, the Grand Lodge of Texas AF & AM Texas Lodge No. 8, and the Shriners of North America Alzafar Shrine Temple.
