On December 14th, 2020 Robert Oliver Hundley, Jr., left this world for heaven. Robert is survived by his children, Robert Hundley III, (wife Debbi), Cynthia Lynne Hundley, and Patrick Hundley, (wife Cheryl), five grandchildren, Cody, Chance, Clayton, Courtney, and Caleb Hundley, eight Great Grandchildren, and his step-children, Marchell Patty, (husband John), Lisa Eberhardt, (husband Dennis), and their children, Kaitlyn Eberhardt and Joshua and Brodie Patty. He is also survived by his brothers and sisters; Ann Nelson, George Hundley, Sr., John Hundley, Roberta Hundley, and two cousins who grew up with him, Charles Hundley, Sr. and William “Bub” Hundley, III. Robert is preceded in death by his brother, David, and his mother and father, Robert Sr. and Roberta.

Born in Crystal City, Texas, Robert moved to San Antonio at a young age. He attended Mark Twain Junior High, and Thomas Jefferson High School, graduating in 1951. He was an All-City football player, playing running back and defensive safety for the State Championship Mustangs (1949) in their 1948, 49 and 50 seasons. After high school he joined the Texas A&M Corps of Cadets, and was a diehard, life-long Aggie! Robert LOVED life, and he lived every day as a new adventure. Seldom depressed or angry, and ALWAYS

interested in the lives of people he met, Robert lived his 87 years with excitement, adventure, and vigor. He hunted almost every kind of game imaginable, on multiple Continents, LOVED to include others in his adventures, was an incredible shot, and passed on his love for hunting, fishing, photography, and nature to his children and grandchildren. Robert's passions in life were people, hunting, photography, football, and Texas A&M. As a sincere Christian, he was not bashful about sharing his faith and hope with those who would listen. In his late 70s and 80s he could often be found asking people, (perfect strangers or friends), if he could pray for them, and then doing so, on the spot. In his career, Robert was a dairy farmer in the San Antonio area throughout the 1960s and 70s, a business owner in Jackson Hole, Wyoming in the late 70s and 80s, and a heavy equipment salesman in San Antonio from then till his retirement. Everything he did in life was usually just a means to meet new people, plan a new hunting or fishing trip, or encourage someone. He loved to ENGAGE in other people's lives, and he would always help out if he could. Robert Hundley, Jr. leaves behind the legacy of his outgoing personality, an infectious enthusiasm for life and adventure, and a love for engaging in others lives.

He will be missed!

Interment will be at Mission Park South, on December 22nd, 2020, with immediate family only, due to covid-19. The family is planning a Memorial Celebration of his life later this spring, once the pandemic has passed.
