



Robert M. Inglis

April 24, 1923 - March 28, 2012

Robert McGowan Inglis, M.D. passed away peacefully in his home on March 28, 2012, a month shy of his eighty-ninth birthday. He was preceded in death by his parents, William Inglis and Margaret McGowan Inglis, by his brother William Inglis, and by his wife Eileen Trezona Inglis. He is survived by his wife Yolanda Peña Inglis, his son Robert M. Inglis Jr, and his daughters Fiona Inglis, Sheena Yarbrough husband Glen and daughter Tiona, and Rosemary Siggelow husband John. Dr. Inglis was born in Dumbarton, Scotland, and graduated from Glasgow University Medical School in 1946. He served as a Captain in the Royal Army Medical Corps from 1947 to 1949, stationed in Ceylon. On his return to the UK he specialized in pulmonary and chest medicine, including the treatment of tuberculosis. Dr. Inglis emigrated from the UK to Texas in 1958, serving first in San Angelo as Clinical Director of the McKnight State Tuberculosis Hospital, then as Superintendent of the San Antonio State Tuberculosis Hospital, and finally as Superintendent of the San Antonio State Hospital SASH, retiring after nearly thirty years of state service. His other interests included photography, orchid cultivation, and most especially automobiles, particularly his classic Jaguars. He was well loved by his two West Highland White Terriers, Sparky and Kipper. Dr. Inglis will be remembered by all who met him, respected by those with whom he worked, and always loved by his family.
