



Robert Peter Pelath

October 24, 1943 - January 26, 2019

On January 26th, 2019, Robert Peter Pelath passed away at the age of 75. Born in Michigan in 1943 to John and Eileen (Dely) Pelath, he was the youngest of three children. Raised in Austin, TX, he excelled in baseball, gaining recognition at a young age and culminating with a brief stint with the Milwaukee Braves minor league team in 1964.

Afterward, he joined the Texas National Guard, serving faithfully until becoming an active duty member of the U.S. Army in 1985. As a systems analyst, he designed computer programs that facilitated efficient troop supply during and between overseas deployments. His job allowed him to travel across the country, and he even spent three years on the island of Guam before transferring to Washington D.C. He was present in the Pentagon during the 9/11 attacks, but retired from active duty shortly after they occurred to become a logistics contractor.

Though he spent a good part of his career in Washington D.C., his heart never left Texas. He will be dearly missed.

Robert is preceded in death by his father, John, and his mother, Eileen. He is survived by his wife, Sherry; his children, Jennifer, Scott, and Clayton; his granddaughter, April; his brothers, John and William; and several nieces, nephews, and cousins. A funeral service with military honors will be held on Wednesday, February 6th, 2019 at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio, TX at 10:15am. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made to the American Liver Foundation.

Funeral Service will be Wednesday, February 6, 2019 at 8:30 a.m. at Mission Park Funeral Chapels South. Interment to follow at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery.
