



Robert R. Popp Sr.

April 7, 1918 - May 17, 2007

Robert Raymond Popp Sr. was born on April 7, 1918 in West, TX, to his parents, Adolph J. Popp and Vincie May Horsak. He spent his early years working on his family's cotton farm. Robert moved with his family to San Antonio, TX in 1928 when his dad sought medical treatment for Vincie. Several times Robert mentioned how he tried to earn money working a newspaper route to supplement the family income. During World War II, Robert enlisted in the US Navy. However, his tour of duty was short since he failed to mention that he had recovered from a broken neck injury prior to his enlistment. He was honorably discharged in 1942. After his discharge from the Navy, Robert returned to San Antonio and married Evelyn Louise Hartman on May 29, 1943 and they began their family of four children. Robert briefly worked as a partner at the Popp Body Shop. In 1950, he began his career as a Home Builder concentrating on the Southeast and Windcrest sections of San Antonio. He also built other homes scattered around San Antonio, China Grove, Converse, and Seguin. Robert retired in 1980 and spent his retirement treasuring his years with Evelyn while enjoying dancing, traveling and casino trips. Robert is preceded in death by his brothers Adolph, Ernest, Albin, and Albert. Robert is survived by his wife Evelyn, daughters Vicki and her husband Ken Reese, Ginger and her husband Don Lee, and sons Robert Jr., his wife Jarolyn Popp, Ron and his wife Carolyn Popp and ten grandchildren.
