



Robert A. Sinclair, Sr.

February 24, 1932 - December 23, 2007

Robert Scotty A. Sinclair, Sr. entered God's loving arms on December 23, 2007 at the age of 75. He was born to Robert Sinclair and Elizabeth Rankie Sinclair in Stirling, Scotland on February 24, 1932. He is survived by his loving wife Doris Gimmeson Sinclair, children: Beth Biggan and husband Dennis of Austin, TX; Robert A. Robert immigrated to the United States in 1950. He completed his high school education in Washington State in 1952. Following graduation he enlisted in the United States Air Force where he served in the medical corps. at Lackland Air Force Base, San Antonio, TX. He was honorably discharged in 1957. Robert became a United States Citizen on January 13, 1956. While serving at Lackland he met and married his loving wife of 51 years, Doris Gimmeson. He furthered his education earning a bachelor's degree in biology from Trinity University and a master's degree in biology from Incarnate Word College. He taught 6 years at Brackenridge High School followed by 26 years at San Antonio College and retired in 1994 as

Associate Professor Emeritus. Robert was an active member of St. Mark's United Methodist Church for the past 50 years. He was a member of the church choir and served on several church committees. Robert joined the Masonic Grand Lodge in Scotland Ancient Stirling #30 in 1950 where he held a lifetime membership. He is a member of the Alzafar Shrine Temple where he was a co-founder of the Alzafar Highlander Pipe Band, served as Pipe Major and was awarded Emeritus status. Robert was also a charter member of the Alamo City Highlander Pipe Band and served as their Pipe Major for many years.
