He was born on May 10, 1949 in Indianapolis, Indiana and moved to Cornish, Maine when he was eleven months old. Rocky was preceded by his father, Richard Leslie Harvey, step-father, Donald Jack, and his brother, Timothy Harvey. He is survived by his wife, Heidi Harvey, sons, Jonathan Dean Harvey and Jason Harvey, mother, Barbara H. Jack, brother, Wallace A. Jack, his sisters, Donna L. Moller and Debra S. McManus, his daughter-in-laws, Tina Harvey and Salina Harvey. He has two grandchildren, Bailey Harvey and Noelle Harvey and a soon to be born Reese Harvey. Rocky served in the U.S. Air Force for twenty-seven years as a Russian Linguist. Most of his military career was behind the Iron Curtain in Berlin, Germany. He also served in other parts of Germany, Japan, England, and the United States. Rocky, then, went on to become an educator and worked for Northside ISD at Pat Neff Middle School for seventeen years. He has been involved in Boy Scouts as a youth for seven years and as an adult for thirteen years. He was a scoutmaster for Troop 228 for five years, a den leader, an adult leader and a Woodbadge participant, a trainer, and a program director. He was pleased to earn Woodbadge beads overseas as an "Owl" and here in San Antonio as an "Eagle".
