In 1977 Romie purchased Hamilton Motors and Fidelity Finance. He formed Eimor Incorporated dba First Fidelity in 1990 where he served as President. Romie will be sorely missed by his loving family and many friends. He was known for his witty humor and debating anything controversial. Romie and Patte were avid tennis players and enjoyed leagues at Retama, Sonterra, Dominion and McFarlin Tennis Center. They made lifetime friends during years of playing. Romie's hobbies also included traveling and photography. Some of Romie and Patte's

best memories were tours led by the San Antonio Zoo, which included Australia, Africa, Rwanda to watch and photograph gorillas, Galapagos Islands, Ecuador, Peru, and Machu Picchu. Romie and Patte went to Hong Kong, Thailand, Macau, London, Scotland, Germany and Vienna. Among their favorites were The US Open, a private tour to the French Open led by Bobby Riggs on one of the last flights by the Concord, Guest passes to the players lounge and players boxes, for the Wimbledon Championship Final. They had years of fun playing tournaments at Trinity University in the Pro-Am tournaments and yearly Mary Mont Tournaments with neighbors and friends.
