



Rose J. Lilly

January 22, 1923 - July 3, 2021

Rose J. Lilly passed away peacefully on July 3 at her residence in Heartis San Antonio. Born on January 22, 1923 in New York City. Her parents Joseph and Antoinette Mugavero were Sicilian immigrants who settled on the Lower East side of Manhattan. At the age of 7 the family moved to the Bensonhurst section of Brooklyn NY, where she lived with her father, four sisters and an older brother. Rose attended Lafayette High School where she developed a beautiful singing voice. She was set on a career in “show business” and radio when she met a young Army Air Force Cadet on leave from flight school, they were married shortly thereafter.

Rose and Al would stay together for over 50 years, raise 5 children and travel the world following Al's career.

In addition to being a singer, synchronized swimmer and dancer, Rose had a successful career in Real Estate, becoming the first woman in San Antonio to reach over \$1,000,000 in sales in 1972. Rose was proud of her Sicilian upbringing. She loved to cook, and Sundays would always have a large pot of sauce on the stove, which was served with homemade meatballs during halftime of the Dallas Cowboys' games. She also loved to listen the Texas Longhorns on the radio every Saturday. Frequently yelling at the radio when a play went awry...

The house was always alive with music, especially the hits of the 40s, with

Frank Sinatra, Ella Fitzgerald and Tony Bennett. Rose was the consummate entertainer, hosting dinner parties, bridge games, coffees and lunches. She loved a house full of people and during the summer months the house was constantly full of children, grandchildren and great grandchildren. An extraordinarily independent woman, Rose swam every day into her 90s and played bridge weekly. Her house was open to anyone, with freshly baked cakes and coffee awaiting all who happened to stop by. "No one leaves my house hungry!"

Rose was preceded in death by her husband of over 50 years, LTC Albert J. Lilly, USAF (Ret.) who was Chief of Police of Universal City Texas, her daughter, Alberta Jegen Lilly and son Albert J. Lilly Jr., as well as her son-in-law, COL Denis Riva, U.S.A.F. (Ret.). Rose is survived by her daughters, Patricia L. Riva of Richmond, VA and Maureen G. Militti and husband, Danny of Omaha, NE; her son, Kevin J. Lilly and wife, Lesley of Houston, TX; her grandchildren include John Jegen of Bitburg, Germany, Christian Jegen of Stamford, CT, Albert J. Lilly, III and James Lilly of Austin, TX, Katherine Lilly of San Diego, CA, Denis P. Riva Jr. and Brian V. Riva both of Richmond, VA. Meghan Rose Gallagher, Danielle Robins, Catherine Militti and Jackie Makarov all of Omaha, NE, Anna Grace Jerles of Holloman AFB, NM, John Albert Lilly and James Ryan Lilly both of Houston, TX; her 14 great grandchildren and 4 great-great grandchildren.
