



Roy Lee Mock

June 14, 1930 - June 22, 2017

Commander Roy Lee Mock, USN, Ret., passed on June 22, 2017 at the age of 87. He is preceded in death by his wife of 60 years, Beth Mock, his sister Neva and many near and dear family members. He is survived by his four children: Brad and Cheryl Mock of New Braunfels, David and Liann Mock of San Antonio, Debbie and Vince Zoda of Bastrop and Diane and Greg King of San Antonio. He is also survived by grandchildren Sara Mock, Colin Mock, James Mock, John Mock and Justin McFall. Other survivors include his sister-in-law and brother-in-law, Jane and Buddy Hardy of Beeville, sisters-in-law Jeanne Reagan of Taft and Sherry Reagan of Beaumont as well as many loved nieces and nephews. Roy was born and raised in Pocahontas, AR. He graduated with a Business degree from the University of Arkansas in 1952, joined the Navy in 1953, later receiving his Naval Aviator wings in 1954, flying single engine jets while serving in the Korean and Vietnam wars as well as experimental aircraft. While he was stationed at NAS Chase Field in Beeville, he met his future wife, Nanabeth Reagan. Roy married Beth in 1955, moved to the west coast and started a family. He was a dedicated, loving father. He spent many years at sea flying off aircraft carriers, returning home every chance he got to spend time with his wife and children. After many tours from Hawaii to England, he got his final orders and they headed back to Beeville in 1972. There he served as head of the flight training department where he was responsible for all academic and flight simulator training of student naval aviators until he retired in 1978. After retiring, he enjoyed doing various jobs

from real estate, corporate aviation and land management. If you asked Roy, his most important job after serving in the Navy was golfing with his friends at Ft. Sam, which was full-time, Monday through Friday and he took it seriously with rule book in hand. When Roy and Beth moved to San Antonio in 1981 they found a new spiritual home at Covenant Presbyterian Church and made many lifelong friends. He enjoyed the coffee and fellowship on Sunday mornings. Roy found great solace at the church, especially in later years. Throughout his life he spent time bowling, golfing, playing pool and watching the Spurs. He especially liked crossword puzzles. Roy had a wicked sense of humor and knew how to use it. He loved instigating rivalries with his kids and grandkids, especially when it came to the Longhorns, the Razorbacks and the Aggies! He never lost his love of speed and was always eager to drive, even if he had to buy a new car to do it. But most important to Roy was Beth, his family, friends and church who he loved deeply. The family would like to express their deep love and appreciation to Tom Reagan for his unconditional love, support and care of his Uncle Roy.
