



## Roy Glenn Taylor

November 23, 1956 - May 1, 2018

Roy Glenn Taylor, Jr., 61, died Tuesday, May 1, 2018 at Methodist Hospital in Boerne, Texas due to congestive heart failure. Prior to his death, he lived with his mother in Boerne, Texas. His health had been declining for years.

He is survived by his mother, Tinnie Louise Taylor, his sister Geneva Sue Wilson, her husband, Michael Wilson and their son, Roy's nephew, Joshua Wilson.

He was preceded in death by his father, Roy Glenn Taylor, Sr. in 2001 and his brother Rodney Clifton Taylor in 2013.

Born in Ft. Worth, Texas November 23, 1956 where his father worked for the City of Ft. Worth and his mother was a stay at home Mom. He was a very active young man who was gifted as an artist. He was the #1 drummer in the band and enjoyed playing football in school in his younger years.

In 1973 his family moved to San Antonio, Texas. Roy then served in the Army from 1974-1977 and then for three years in the reserve. During his time of service he earned two National Defense Service Medals. One for being an expert marksman with a M16 rifle and the other for being an expert marksman tank gunner.

After serving in the military, Roy owned and operated a small Landscaping business for many years. He loved hunting and fishing, especially with his brother Rodney or other family members. He helped run a fishing and tackle store with Rodney for two years until the time of its closing.

At family gatherings, he was known for telling stories of the shenanigans he and his brother Rodney got into growing up. They were always good for a laugh and a bit of shock at times for his mother, Tinnie.

He had a strong faith in God for his whole life and would give to religious organizations anytime he was able.

After his brother's store closed, Roy gave up any goals for himself when he chose to stay home and help his mother care for Rodney, who was handicapped and in a wheelchair from an accident at 16. He did that until Rodney's death in 2013.

Roy had a pet cat named Storm that he rescued after the cat had been abandoned. Storm was his faithful companion for 20 years until his death a week before Roy himself passed.

His funeral will be held on Wednesday, May 9, 2018 at Mission Park Funeral Chapels & Cemeteries 20900 IH 10 West, San Antonio, Texas 78257 at 10:00 a.m. with a viewing at 9:30 a.m.
