Ruby Marie Jamison passed away on Sunday, March 4, 2007. She was 102 years old. Ruby was born December 24th, 1904 on a farm near Anneville, in Wise County, Texas to Mary Martha Elizabeth Arrington and Charles Redden Jamison. She had four brothers Charlie, Virgil, Harvey and Earl and two sisters Bertha and Anna Lois; she is survived by her sister Anna Lois Eldridge, and numerous nieces and nephews, including Laverne Flowers, Dottie Wilson, Sissy Jordan, Dickey Jamison, Susie deLeeuw, Nancy Stolz, Beverly Slade, and Bobby Jamison. She served others with selfless devotion, especially helping her niece Betty Rote, after a stroke had left Betty paralyzed; and again taking care of her brother Earl during his last years. She was always full of energy and thoughtfulness. In her later years she enjoyed the company of her good friends Gwen and Ole Langland in San Antonio. Four years ago she moved to Corpus Christi and lived with her friends at Homewood Residence, and especially enjoyed the company of Sandra Cole and her other caretakers. Her grandnephew Chris Rote and wife, Carey watched over her closely and celebrated many happy moments together. Her nephew Bob Jamison visited her often and wrote her many letters. Ruby loved wearing the clothes her sister Anna Lois made for

her. Ruby was loved by all her family and friends. She lived a long and wonderful life.
