He attended the races not only as a spectator but also to plan for his next challenge. He was always in search of car parts by visiting auto shows and swap meets thinking about his next BIG project. Rudolph was also a longtime member of the Bandidos MC where he was also well respected. He enjoyed riding and traveling around the nation and the world with his “Brothers”. There wasn't a day that went by where someone was reaching out to him to talk about hotrods or asking him how to fix an issue with their car, something he very much enjoyed. were his dreams of building cars using his mind despite having dropped out of school because of his dyslexia, but he was a fast learner and very determined. Everyone that knew my dad knew that he was all about racing. Building and fabricating his own design, a passion he made sure everyone knew by building unique things and never before seen stuff or making something go faster. Not only did my dad modify race cars but he also built go-karts and even a hotrod riding lawnmower, imagine that! That's just what made my dad, Rudolph, so unique and well known for his knowledge locally and around the world.
