SFC Waconda Ford Roscoe, U.S. Army Ret, passed away on April 20, 2006 at the age of 91. Mr. Roscoe entered the Army in 1941, was a veteran of W.W. II, and retired in 1971 after over 30 years of service to his country. He was a member of Beacon Hill Presbyterian Church for over 60 years where he served as an Elder and also recorded the Sermons for the past 20 years, delivering them to those unable to attend. He was a lifetime member of the VFW, Disabled American Veterans and an avid Bowler.

When Ford was in the Fourth Grade, he won an Arithmetic Contest, coming in first with the correct answer and the teacher came in second with an incorrect answer. In 7th grade, he came in second in a citywide contest for all subjects by $\frac{1}{2}$ point, causing him to lose an airplane ride over the city. Ford sold newspapers and magazines as a boy before joining the Army.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Robert Bruce Roscoe and Allie Gayle Ford; and his brother, Norman Roscoe. Survivors include his wife of 60 years, Leila Niven Roscoe who is now 95 years of age; two daughters: Barbara Clevensine, and Pauline Morgan and her husband, Ralph; a brother, Melvin Hicks and his wife Doris; grandchildren: SSgt Kathy Morgan, 2Lt Christine Morgan Dossman and her husband 2Lt Dusty Dossman, Douglas Clevensine, Rebecca Clevensine Reschke and her husband Wally, and Norman Clevensine; and several nieces and nephews.
