Sharon Helen Woldhagen, 80, passed away on May 18, 2026 in San Antonio, Texas.

In 1998, Sharon returned to San Antonio, where she remained actively engaged in her faith and community. She was a devoted member of University Methodist Church, singing in the choir and participating in numerous service initiatives alongside cherished friends.

Sharon embraced her Norwegian heritage, especially through treasured family recipes she lovingly prepared for special occasions. She had a passion for singing, gardening, and traveling with friends. She was also known for her talents as a seamstress, cook, and baker, and for hosting warm, memorable gatherings that brought loved ones together.

Sharon's wisdom, resilience, and generous spirit will be deeply missed and fondly remembered by all who knew and loved her.

She is survived by her daughters, Scarlett Collums Richardson and Heidi Collums Garcia; grandchildren, Zayana, Emiliano Jr., Jim Palmer Garcia; and longtime parter, Homero Rodriguez. She was preceded in death by her parents and her sister.
