July 20, 1934 - January 16, 2010

Stephen Lee Page, age 75, entered into eternal rest Saturday January 16, 2010. Born in Abilene, Texas on July 20, 1934, Lee was the youngest of 10 children. He attended Hardin Simmons University where he played trombone in the "Cowboy Band." He carried a love of music throughout his life. The highlight of Lee's professional career were the years he spent working for American Security Life Insurance, serving as Executive Vice President and Chief Marketing Officer. Lee maintained an active interest in local and national politics. He could always be counted on to express a strong opinion about anything to do with political matters. Always a patriotic American, he ran for office in Wichita Falls, TX in the 1960's. When he wasn't working, Lee enjoyed numerous rounds of golf, playing bridge, and ballroom dancing.

Lee is survived by his loving wife Mary Frances Powell Page, daughter Gayla Armstrong and her husband Steve Watley and their children Crystal Watley and Joseph Cousert, Amanda Watley and Adam Watley; son Kelly Page, son Mark Armstrong and his children Colt and Race Armstrong; and daughter Judi Page and her children John Page, Brandi Page, Scotty Sewell and Stephanie Sewell. He is also survived by 2 brothers, Les Page and wife Jeanette of Houston, and Robert Page and wife Glynn of Pittsburgh, PA. In addition Lee is survived by numerous nieces, nephews, cousins and great grandchildren that will miss his hugs and humor. He leaves behind many dear friends and close business associates who will also miss him and his quick wit. His greatest

wish was to be remembered as a "good ole boy".
